A frenetic tour of the globe showing how humanity has grown apart from nature. Powered by a relentless Philip Glass soundtrack that leaves no room for words.



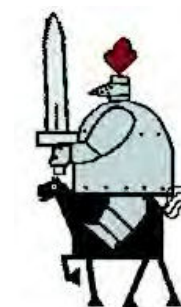
Fri 5th February 2016

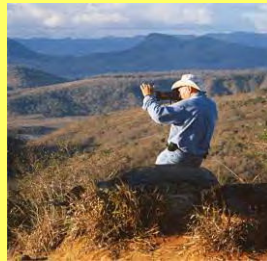

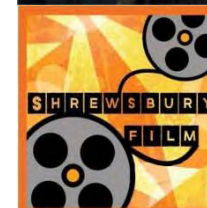
